A31(3) Officer Satisfied

- a) Residency Obligation A28
- b) H&C Assessment
- c) 1/365 (appealed) / 60 Appeal Period (Failed but PRTD issued)

## 1. Meets Residency Obligation A28

**A28(1)** A permanent resident must comply with a residency obligation with respect to every five-year period

A28(2)(a) Compliance = at least 730 days in that 5yr period...

# Permanent Resident Determination and Travel Document - PRTD Residency Obligation – A28

### 1. Meets Residency Obligation A28

## A28(2)(a)(i)

Physically present

# A28(2)(a)(ii)

Outside Canada accompanying (R61(4)) a CDN CIT SP/CL or parent (R61(6))

## A28(2)(a)(iii)

Outside Canada employed FT by a CDN Business, Federal/Provincial Public Service

### A28(2)(a)(iv)

Outside Canada, accompanying a PR SP/CL or parent who is employed full-time by a CDN Business, Federal/Provincial Public Service

# Permanent Resident Determination and Travel Document - PRTD Residency Obligation – A28

**R61(1)** Definition **of** a Canadian business (Corporation, Enterprise, Organization – ongoing CDN operations, revenue generating, with majority control being Canadian)

**R61(2)** a Canadian business does not include a business that serves primarily to allow a permanent resident to comply with their residency obligation while residing outside Canada.

- **61(3)** an employee of or under contract to provide services to, a Canadian business or the public service of Canada or of a province, and assigned full-time as a term of the employment or contract to
- (a) a position outside Canada;
- (b) an affiliated enterprise outside Canada; or
- (c) a client of the Canadian business or the public service outside Canada.

# Permanent Resident Determination and Travel Document - PRTD Employed FT by a Canadian Business?

Rosanne is a Permanent Resident and works for PEEPSRUS, a consulting firm specializing in Human Resources development and training. PEEPSRUS Inc., is a company incorporated in Canada with its HQ in Toronto.

In the spring of 2013, BIGGERNU Inc, an American computer software company based in California contracted PEEPSRUS Inc to train the employees of KNOTSOS MALL Inc., a Beijing company, on the use of their new accounting software program. Rosanne was sent for 120 days to Beijing to train the employees of KNOTSOS MALL Inc.

Can the days spent in Beijing by Rosanne be counted for the residency obligation test?

Yes.

Rosanne was assigned abroad under contract to provide services to a client of the Canadian business (BIGGERNU Inc.)

### 2. A28 H&C Assessment

And if they fall short of 730?

### PFL / Solicit for H&C considerations

A28(2)(c) a determination by an officer that humanitarian and compassionate considerations relating to a permanent resident, taking into account the best interests of a child directly affected by the determination, justify the retention of permanent resident status overcomes any breach of the residency obligation prior to the determination.

# Permanent Resident Determination and Travel Document - PRTD Case Study - 1

Two sisters came from South Africa (SA) with their parents to Canada as PRs in July 1994. They returned to SA with their parents for business reasons in 6mths later. The family made short visits to Canada in 1995, 96, 98 and 2000 but never stayed to reside in Canada.

In 2015 when the sisters were aged 24 and 25, their parents renounced PR status in order to visit Canada. The sisters applied in 2016 for relief from meeting the residency obligation on H&C grounds. The application was dismissed by an officer – appealed to the IAD (Immigration Appeals Decision).

# Permanent Resident Determination and Travel Document - PRTD Case Study - 1

The IAD said the seriousness and breach of the residency obligation was significant, but that it was not the decision of the sisters, then minors, to leave Canada, although the H&C would have been more substantial if applied when the sisters became age of majority.

The IAD stated that the sisters "now seek the relative political and economic stability of Canada" and that a failure to provide the relief would be unfair and possibly "dangerous or cruel". The IAD said by remaining in SA, the sisters would face general hardships that could only be alleviated by allowing the appeal.

# Permanent Resident Determination and Travel Document - PRTD Case Study - 1

The Minister appealed and said that the IAD erred when they minimized the breach of the residency obligation, failed to consider the complete failure of the sisters to establish in Canada and unreasonably assessed hardship

The Federal judge ruled that the IAD's analysis of hardship lacked justification, transparency and intelligibility. He was concerned with the depth of analysis on the issue of hardship given the IAD's firm conclusions that failure to provide relief would be "unfair" and even "dangerous" and "cruel. The IAD also did not seem to weigh that the family appeared to have built successful lives in SA with no personal affect from security or racist concerns.

# Permanent Resident Determination and Travel Document - PRTD Residency Obligation A28 – Designated Officer

# <u>DESIGNATED OFFICER?</u>

**MAY 2018** 

"Be satisfied that a PR meets the requirements; issue PRTD" <u>IL3 Item 46</u> - Migration Officer and DIO

"Determine PRC does not reflect the status of the person" IL3 Item 45 - Migration Officer and DIO

"Determine whether H&C considerations justify retaining status" <u>IL3 Item 44</u> - Migration Officer

"Issue or <u>refuse</u> to issue a PRTD" (Insufficient H&C) <u>IL3 Item 47</u> - Migration Program Managers

Permanent Resident Determination and Travel Document - PRTD Eligibility Failed: PRTD Issued

## 3. 1/365 Within 60 Day Appeal Period

Present in Canada at least 1/365 +

- Appeal Decision Pending or
- 60 day Appeal Period not expired A31(3)(c)

# Two Other Reasons where a PRD would be FAILED; but an officer would issue a PRTD

- IAD calls for applicant to testify A175(2)
- IAD overturns the refusal, PR status upheld

Permanent Resident Determination and Travel Document - PRTD Renunciation

### **RENUNCIATION**

<u>A46(1)(e):</u> A person loses permanent resident status on approval by an officer of their application to renounce their permanent resident status

- App to voluntarily Renounce PR Status (IMM5782)
- PDI on Processing Renunciations of PR status
- Must have PR/CIT in another country: (can not be rendered stateless)
- Minors need signatures from ALL who share custody

IL3 Item 26

"Approve / refuse an application to renounce PR status" : Migration Officers, DIO, NIO Permanent Resident Determination and Travel Document - PRTD Lost or Stolen – Reported at Mission

### **LOST OR STOLEN PR CARD PROCEDURE:**

### **ENF 27 - 9.2**

PRs may occasionally report a lost or stolen PR card to a visa office abroad, to an IRCC office in Canada, or to the Call Centre.

Officers receiving reports of lost or stolen PR cards must immediately notify PRC-Sydney-Urgent@cic.gc.ca so that the necessary updates to GCMS can be made.

PRs must report their lost or stolen PR cards through official channels by completing and signing a solemn declaration to CPC-PRC [IMM 5451E] if in Canada or at a visa office if outside Canada — and along with their PRTD application, if this is their reason for requiring a PRTD. A police report may be submitted along with the solemn declaration.
